Introduction to The Basics

Thank you for downloading “How to Create Surprising Microsoft® Paint Effects.”

In this e-book you'll be learning some special effects that you can get with Microsoft® Paint that you might not have known could be done. This free graphic software program was probably included when you purchased your windows-based computer.

Now you can learn how to get a lot more out of it!

Before we begin learning tips and tricks that will bring out your artistic creativity, let's briefly explore the basic tools of Microsoft® Paint.

The Color Palette



The color palette provides a quick way to instantly change the colors you're using with the click of your mouse. Although you may only see 28 blocks of color on the palette at one time, you are not limited by these as Microsoft® Paint allows you to create a rainbow of colors.

In the above image of the color box, black is selected as the foreground color, and white as the background. To change the color of either, use the left mouse button to change the foreground, and the right button for the background.

The Tool Bar



The tool bar or box is where the real action happens as it allows you to choose from 16 different options, many with their own individual, customizable options that appear at the bottom of the tool area.

Here are the 16 tools for you to use:

Select



This tool enables you to select a rectangular shaped area.

Free-Form Select



This tool selects a free-form area of your work.

Eraser/Color Eraser



You can erase down to the original white of the program or erase to a selected color.

Fill with Color



First you select an area with either the rectangular select tool or the free-form selection tool. Then you pick the color you want with the pick color tool and fill it by selecting the fill with color tool.

Pick Color



This tool picks the color you want from the colors that are available or you create new colors of your choice.

Magnifier



Click on this tool to enlarge your view of the painting.

Pencil



This tool makes a fine pencil line in the color of your choice. You can choose other sizes of the pencil tool by holding down the Control key on the right of the keyboard and then holding down the plus or minus key on the far right edge of your keyboard at the same time.

Brush



There are several choices of brush sizes and shapes that go with this tool. You can also create other sizes by holding down the Control key on the right of the keyboard while simultaneously holding down the plus or minus key at the right edge of the keyboard to enlarge or reduce the size of this brush tool.

It's simple to change the size and shape of the brush tool in Microsoft® Paint!

In the following image, the brush tool is selected displaying 12 options to choose from at the bottom of the tool box.



Change the thickness and shape of the brush tool with a click of the mouse, then select the color of your choice. Dragging the mouse pointer across the canvas you can begin painting your masterpiece.

Airbrush



There are three choices of airbrush sizes that go with this tool. You can also create other sizes by holding down the Control key on the right of the keyboard while simultaneously holding down the plus or minus key at the right edge of the keyboard to enlarge or reduce the size of this brush tool.

Text



Click on the text tool to add text to your image.

Line



This tool creates individual straight lines to create the shape you desire.

Curve



This tool creates straight lines that you grab by an attached handle to make the curved lines that make up your artwork.

Rectangle



This tool makes a simple rectangle.

Polygon



You can make complex shapes with various angles with this tool.

Ellipse



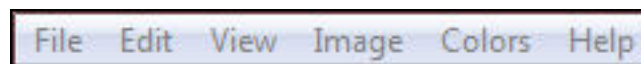
This tool makes various shapes and sizes of ovals and circles.

Rounded Rectangle



Create rectangles with rounded corners with this tool.

The Menu Bar



Use the Menu Bar to easily navigate through the six menus of Microsoft® Paint.

The File Menu allows you to create new or open existing documents, save, and print documents. Here is where you can change the size and orientation of the canvas by selection Page Setup.

The Edit Menu option allows you to undo or reverse your actions, clear selected areas, and the ever important, cut, copy, and paste selections.

The View Menu is where you can customize the appearance of Microsoft® Paint based on your personal preferences. Use View to either show or hide the tool bar, color palette, or the status bar at the bottom of the screen. View also allows you to zoom in on an image up to 800%.

Under the Image Menu you can completely clear an image you're working on, or flip and rotate certain areas of the picture, and also invert color schemes in designated areas. The resize and skew options are also located here under the Image Menu, as well as the option to establish attributes of the image such as the size, color, or black and white option.

Next is the Colors Menu where you can define custom colors and add them to your palette box for later use.

The final option is the Help Menu where you can explore the help topics provided by the program.



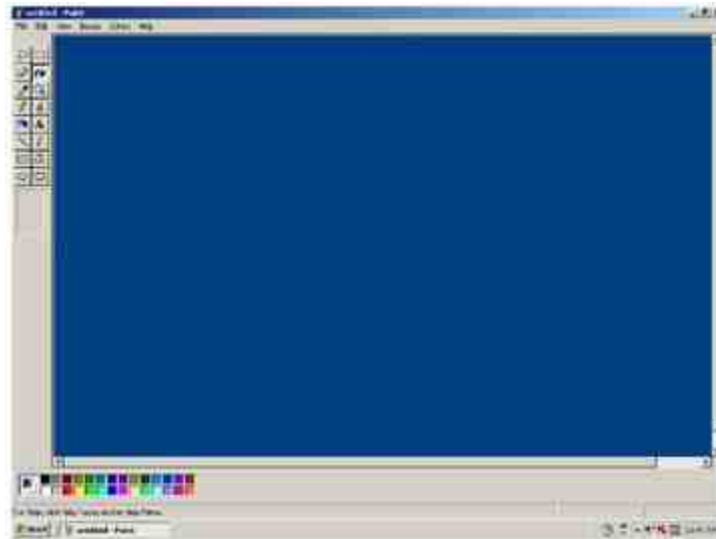
If you'd like to paint using the foreground color, simply click and use the right mouse button instead of the left.

If you make a mistake, you can reverse your actions by clicking Edit on the Menu Bar, and then Undo.

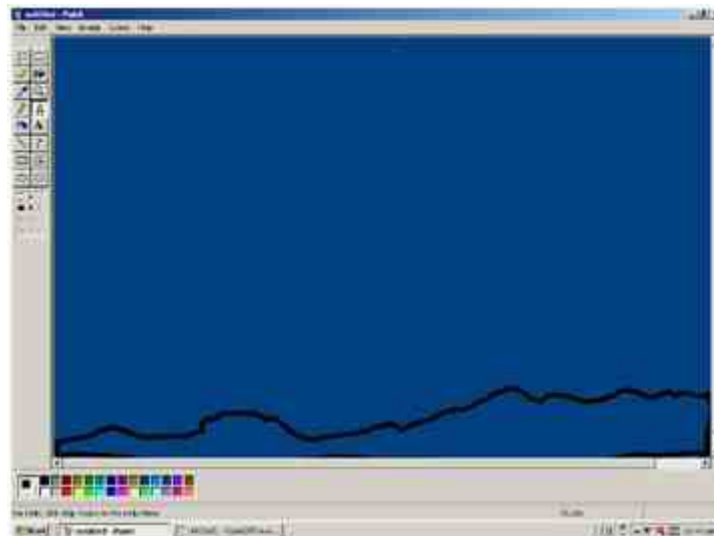
Moonlit Landscape

Step 1 – Begin the painting with Pick Color and Fill Tools.



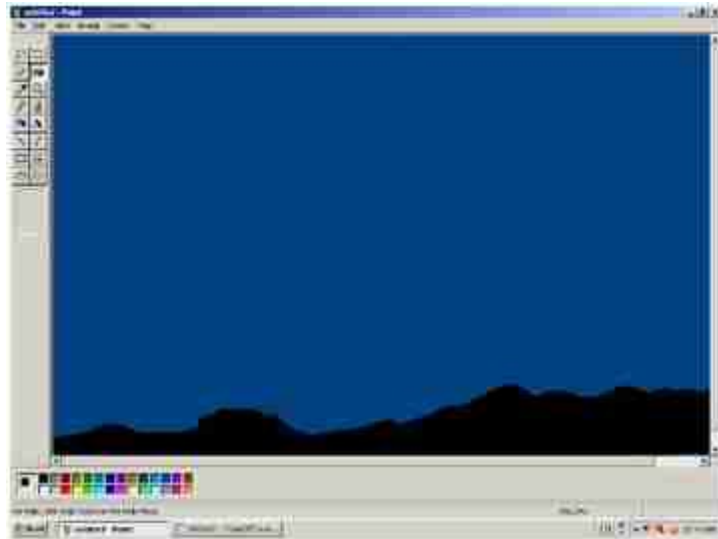
1. Select the pick color tool.
2. Choose a color at the bottom of the screen on the left or create your own by clicking on colors at the top of the screen and then clicking on edit colors.
3. Select the fill color tool.
4. Click on the screen.
5. Your chosen colored background will appear.

Step 2 – Here's how to enclose an area to prepare to fill it with color



1. Select the brush tool.
2. Choose the smallest size of the options on the bottom left of your computer screen.
3. Select the Color Picker tool and choose black.
4. Outline the mountains and the sides and bottom below them.

Step 3 – Fill the mountains with black.



1. Make sure there are no spaces in the line in the step above. If there are spaces, when you fill the mountains with black, the entire screen will fill with black. That's because the color escapes from the opening in the line.

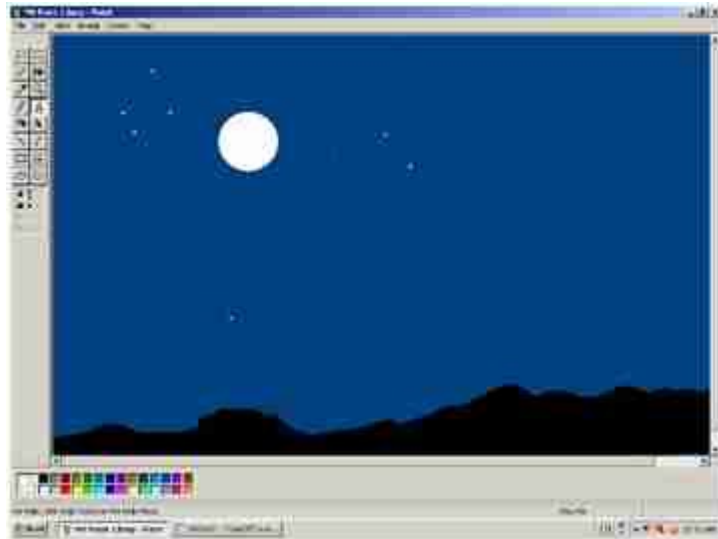
2. If you accidentally fill the screen with black, hit Control Z to undo your mistake.

3. Choose the Fill with Color tool.

4. Click inside the mountain area.

5. The mountains will fill with black.

Step 4 – Make your own brushes to create moon and stars.



1. Choose Color Picker tool and select white.
2. Select Brush tool. Choose small round shape.
3. Twist your left arm and hand until you can simultaneously place your thumb on the Control key on the right side of the keyboard and your left little finger or another finger on the plus sign on the far right edge of your keyboard.
4. With your hand in that twisted position and your thumb remaining on the Control key, hold the plus sign down until the brush tool enlarges to create the moon.
5. After holding the plus sign down for a little while, release your left hand and place the brush tool where you want the moon to be. If your moon is too small, adjust it until it is larger.
6. Each time you try the size of the moon, you can undo what you did by clicking Control Z. If it is too large, instead of pressing the plus key, press the minus key just above the plus sign. That will make the brush tool smaller.
7. Make the stars in the same way except use the pencil tool instead. You can also make the stars different colors. You can make a star one color and then fill it with white in a smaller circle leaving a colored rim.

Step 5 – Enclose the horizon sky and create different color.



1. Select the Color Picker tool and choose the color you want by the mountains.
2. Choose the Brush tool and select the smallest size. Outline the cloud area in every direction – horizontally, along both sides and include the area just above the mountains.
3. Select the Fill Color tool and click inside the new cloud area.
4. The clouds above the mountains will appear.

Step 6 – Use the Airbrush tool to soften the clouds near the horizon.



1. Choose the Color Picker tool and select a blending color a little darker than the clouds you just created.
2. Choose the Airbrush tool and select the medium or largest size.
3. Blend with the Airbrush the hard line of the cloud area.

Step 7 – Create your own brush to complete the clouds.



1. Choose the random select tool and draw an enclosed circle around a small section of the clouds that you want to extend upward and

swirl the brush around.

2. Hold down the shift key and drag up and to the right and move around the cloud area according to what you'd like to see.

3. Be sure you don't release the Shift button or you'll have to select another section and drag it. The shift button keeps your brush going.

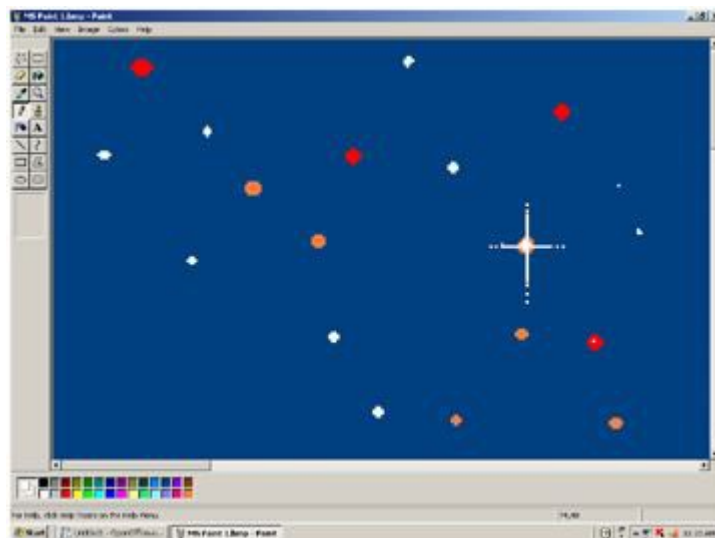
4. Making your own brush is a very special feature of Microsoft® Paint that many people aren't aware of.

Step 8 – Zoom in to create rays of star.

1. Select Zoom from the menu under View. I chose 400%.

2. I selected a star so I could make rays shining from it. To do this, select the Line tool and hold down the shift key. That will automatically keep the lines straight.

3. I added short sections after the lines to fade the edges of the rays off. Otherwise, they would have been too blunt.



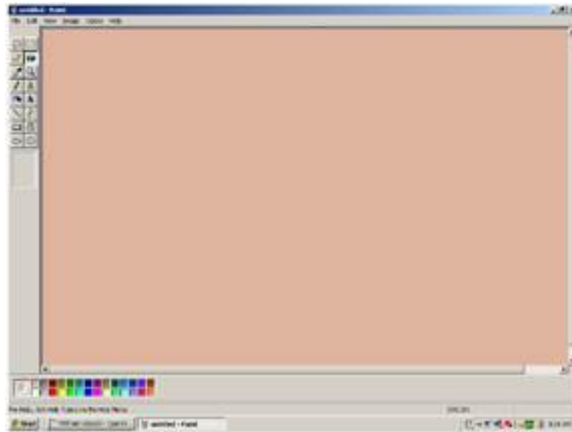
Step 9 – View star after rendering it and create foreground.



1. After completing the star's rays, I worked on making more details in the foreground.
2. I added a path and made some shadows on the mountains.

Portrait Demonstration

Step 1 – Fill Screen with flesh color.



1. Select the pick color tool.
2. Choose a color at the bottom of the screen on the left or create your own by clicking on colors at the top of the screen and then clicking on edit colors.
3. Select the fill color tool.
4. Click on the screen.
5. Your chosen colored background will appear.

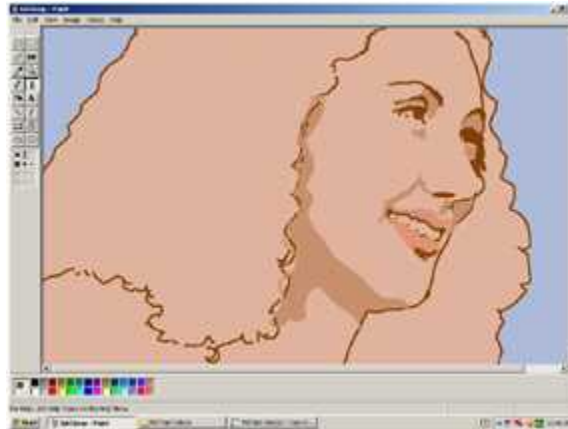
Step 2 – Draw outline of woman's face with the Brush tool.



1. Select Color Picker tool and select brown.

2. Do a basic drawing of the woman's features plus hair shape.
3. Add blue background.

Step3 – Begin selecting and filling shadows and lip color.



1. To add shadows, select the Color Picker and choose a darker flesh tone.
2. You'll need to create your own color under Colors in the menu on the top of the screen.
3. Then select Define Custom Colors.
4. A new window will open where you can select the shade you want and the intensity of the colors you choose.
5. Save your custom colors.
6. Next select the brush tool and outline the shadow area making sure there are no gaps in the outline.
7. Choose Fill tool.
8. Click on shadow and area and it will fill with shadow color.
9. If you make a mistake and entire screen fills with shadow color, hold down the Control key while you press z.
10. Add blue background by following the method for adding shadows. Obviously, you'll choose blue instead of the flesh tone.

Step 4 – Begin selecting and filling in hair color.

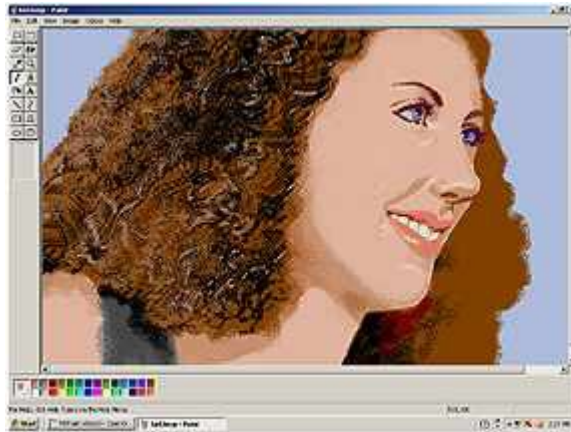


Step 5 – Continue adding details to woman's face.



1. You can add details by simply drawing with your chosen color instead of outlining and filling in areas. Sometimes it's easier to outline and fill and other times it's simpler just to draw on your images

Step 6 – Start adding form to hair and add more details to the face.



1. To use the same colors for different areas of the skin, click the Pick Color tool on a color you want to choose.
2. Your brush or pencil or Airbrush tool load with that color.

Step 7 – Zoom in to add details to woman's eyes.



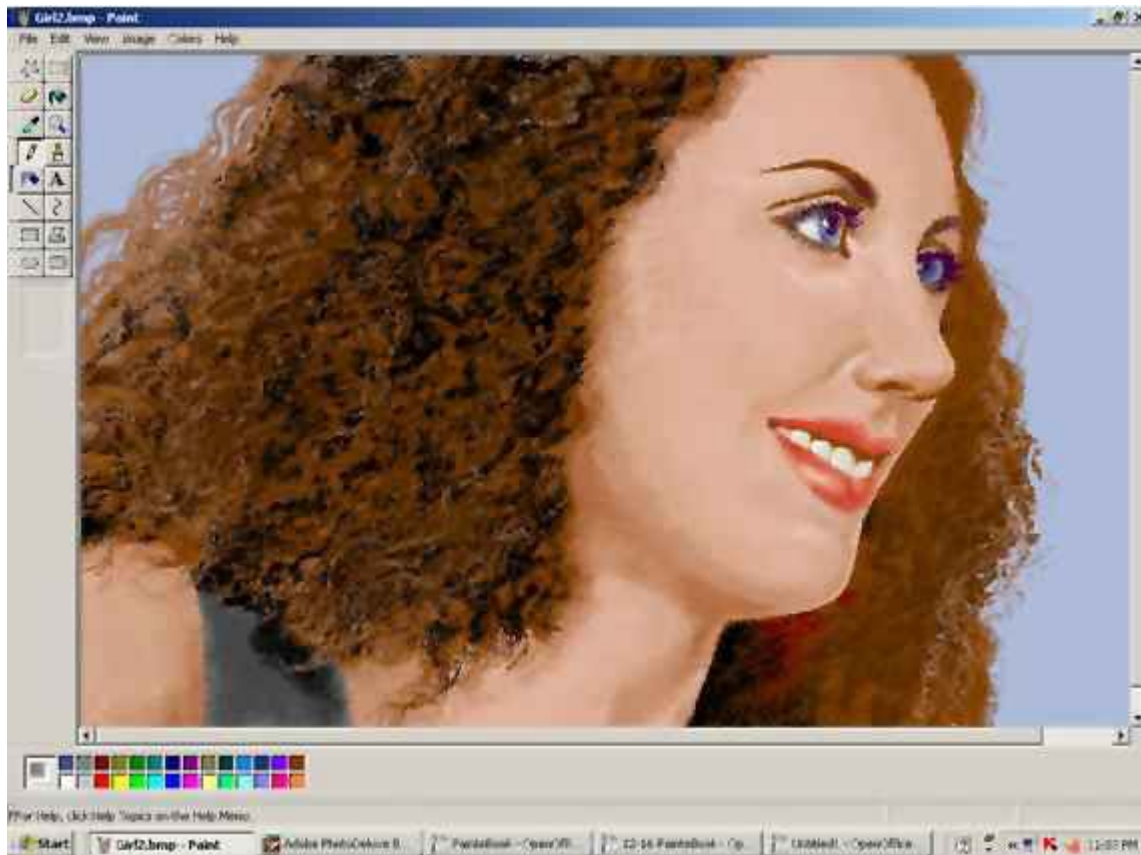
1. I zoomed in so I could make the details more easily.
2. I carefully drew in the eyelashes, eyebrows, the whites of the woman's eyes, the pupils and the highlights.

Step 8 – Continue adding form and color to face.

1. I did a lot of detailing in the hair with the brush tool using the line option. By choosing the line option I was able to make thick and thin lines that added to the realism of the hair.
2. There's light shining on the back of her hair which gives more dimension to her hair.



Step 9 – Complete portrait.



1. I find that rendering flesh so it looks three dimensional is tricky in Microsoft® Paint because it's difficult to get smooth facial tones.
 2. I used the Airbrush tool along with direct drawing with the Pencil tool to try to get the flesh looking as realistic as possible.

The gold page tells us that God loves the world.

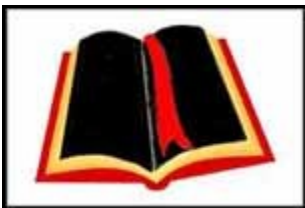
His love is better than pure gold. He is preparing a beautiful home for His children where even the streets are made of transparent gold.

Do you believe this?



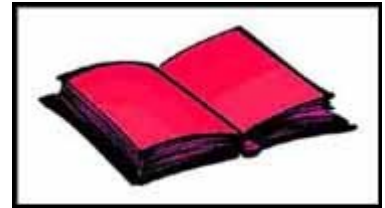
But there's a sad part to this true story. The dark page reveals that God will not allow any sin into heaven, for sin would spoil His beautiful home.
